On Sunday, November 26, we will celebrate *Christ the King Sunday*, which is the last Sunday of the Church Year. At 6:15 p.m. that day, we will gather for our Advent Family Workshop, creating an Advent craft as we prepare for the Advent season. The first Sunday of Advent will be December 3.


